**Public Question Time**

There were no members of the public present.

**078/19 Apologies for Absence**

Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs Richard Selwood and Phil Shepherd.

**079/19 Declarations of Interest**

There were no Declarations of Interest in any matters being discussed at this meeting.

**080/19 Planning Matters**

19/04598/OUT – Land South of Hook Street, Lydiard Tregoze  
Proposed outline permission for up to 9 dwellings together with parking and amenity space (All matters reserved)

After consideration at a meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> July it was resolved to object to the application on the following grounds:

- Extra Traffic Movements will cause additional pressures on roads locally
- Construction vehicles must adhere to the weight limit restrictions on the roads within the parish

Members were reminded that a matter once decided can only be reconsidered if there are material considerations that would affect the original decision. The law requires that it is unreasonable and therefore ultra vires (outside its powers) unless there is a material change in the matters under consideration. It was therefore recommended that the Council should carefully document those matters which it considers new and material before moving on to consider any enhancement to its existing objection to the application.

The following points were considered as new information, that was not available at the time of the original decision.

- a. The application is a more serious matter than first thought, including traffic disruption and noise,
- b. It sets a precedence for all land use,
- c. Having read comments from other Consultees members wished to change their response.

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Chairman's Initials

RESOLVED to strongly oppose and emphatically object to this application due to it being in the Essential Setting of Lydiard Park as specified in an earlier letter Lydiard Millicent Parish Council were signatories to. Lydiard Park is a National Treasure. This will also impact on traffic through this parish, as Hook Street is a single track road with passing places, so will use The Street in Lydiard Millicent instead.

081/19 **Exclusion of the Press and Public**

RESOLVED that due to the confidential nature of the discussion and being prejudicial to the public interest members of the public and press were to be asked to leave the meeting.

082/19 **Approach from a Land Developer**

RESOLVED that the LMPC Neighbourhood Plan is a robust plan. There is no need to change the size of the buffer as this is the minimum required for the needs of the parish to separate this parish with Swindon.
